We have explored the home corner and roleplayed families, designed a scarecrow for our scarecrow competition, drawn self-portraits and made lots of paintings!

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


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## Here are a few topic related activity ideas to try at home:

- Read with your child five times a week please! You could re-read one of the stories we have read at school; Monkey Puzzle by Julia Donaldson or the Usborne Farmyard Tales.
- Play dice games such as snakes and ladders, or domino games. This will help your child to subitize numbers (recognise groups of dots up to 6 without counting them)
- Next week we are going to read the story of Owl Babies. Perhaps you could learn some facts about owls from information books and discuss birds; where do they live? What do they eat? You could even do some bird watching or hunt for signs of bird nests.
