In Literacy and Communication and Language we will be learning to...

- Link sounds to letters, naming and sounding letters of the alphabet.
- Orally segment and blend words.
- Give meaning to the marks we make, increasingly using clearly identifiable letters.
- Use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.
- Increasingly writing sentences and captions.
