







Federation News

Our governing board met earlier this week to formally agree to explore federation with Thundridge School. A working party of governors has been set up and they will meet with representatives from Thundridge later this month to begin to discuss ways the schools can work together more closely in the future. In the short term, this is likely to involve shared trips and activities with children from both schools and shared training for staff. Stakeholder views on the formal process are likely to be sought in autumn term.
