## Attendance

As a school we are aware that the last two years have been a very challenging time for us all. There have been times when children may not have been allowed to attend school due to having to isolate as a result of having Covid/being a close contact or they have been sent home as a result of being symptomatic. All of this has meant that our children's attendance in school has been affected very often through no fault of our own. We are all hoping that this period is well and truly behind us.

However, it is now more important than ever that all children attend school regularly. Children are still in the process of catching up on any missed learning and any missed school days only serves to exacerbate this situation and could lead to children falling further behind. Pupil absence also impacts on teaching routines and the learning of others in the same class.

Any child whose absence falls below 95% will be monitored and parents may receive a letter from the school inviting you to discuss ways in which we can support families and children to develop better attendance.

This chart demonstrates the amount of lost learning due to days absent from school. The school may take preventative action if attendance falls below 'Good' and legal action where attendance becomes a 'Cause for concern'.

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Of course, we appreciate and understand that sometimes absence is out of parents' control and there may be times where children are not in school because they are too ill to attend. However, if any child is regularly absent through repeated illness then parents may be asked to provide medical evidence to support this.
